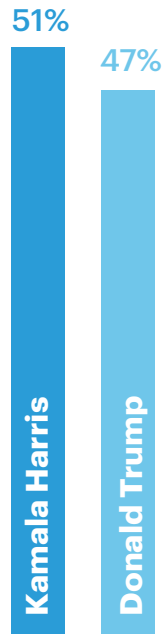


2024 GENERAL ELECTION WRAP-UP

Minnesota voted for the Harris/Walz ticket, carrying on a streak of 48 years of voting Democrat in the presidential election, but that wasn't the case nationally. Donald Trump won both the popular vote and electoral college, and is set to capture most, if not all, the battle ground states needed to win the presidency. The United States Senate flipped from Democrat to Republican as well, and we are awaiting final vote tallies to determine control of the United States House of Representatives.

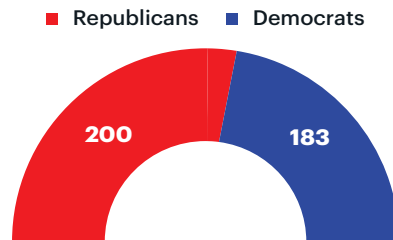


Presidential Race in Minnesota

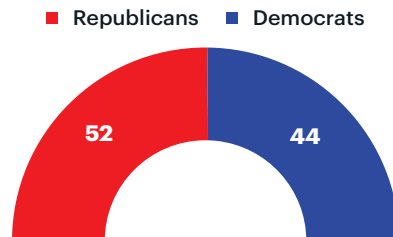


United States House of Representatives

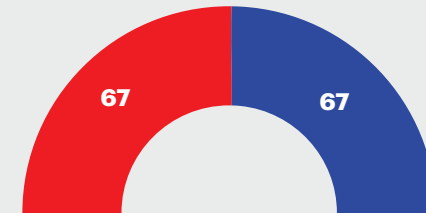

Minnesota Senate District 45, which was vacated by former Senator Kelly Morrison, was won by DFL candidate Ann Johnson Stewart. This is significant, as the DFL remain in control of the Minnesota State Senate by one vote, 34-33. The Minnesota House of Representatives saw three seats flip to Republican, which currently puts the Minnesota House of Representative in a 67-67 tie. Two races will go to recount, as they are too close to call. A tie in the Minnesota House of Representatives happened in 1979, which made legislative negotiations a difficult task.

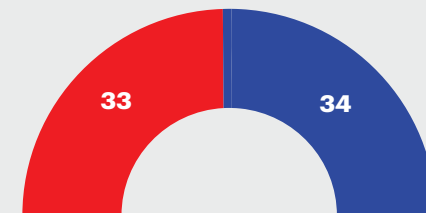
Minnesota State House of Representatives
